FREE FOOD FOR LOW INCOME SENIORS




Parish Finances – Third Quarter Collections Update Our Parish Continues to Needs Your Financial Support

Religious Persecution Worldwide - 2 Types: In North America and Europe we see a "Polite Persecution" through intimidation and legislation. In Asia and Africa we see more and more "Violent Persecution."

1. Polite Persecution: In Michigan, Fired for her Faith: A Catholic clinical social worker with 20 years experience providing individual

psychological counseling to a diverse group of patients, was fired because she refused marriage counseling to a same-sex couple. Her supervisor said she had to be a "social worker first and a Catholic second."

2. Violent Persecution: Radicalized Hindus have increased violent attacks on the religious minorities of Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, and Buddhists. These range from arson of churches to priests beaten & killed, nuns raped, and the destruction of Christian schools, colleges, and cemeteries.
