A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Last weekend, some of our parishioners were approached by a woman in the parking lot asking for money after Sunday morning Mass. Unfortunately, this happens from time to time and we have discovered that more often than not they are scams. This particular woman from Suffolk County and driving an older model car with a broken trunk had been here in May. The scenario is always the same: she needs money and only money for an emergency. I did approach her and had a conversation with her and she willingly left the property. Although non-catholic, she was resistant to any offer of legitimate help through our St. Vincent de Paul Society or even a church of her own denomination. She visits various churches each Sunday, and often approaches older women. After a conversation with the police, several pastors have been directed to offer the following advice: Do not engage this individual in conversation, but simply proceed to your car. If the individual is persistent, you may wish to return to church and use your cell phone to call 911. If you do not have a cell phone, there is an emergency phone in the sacristy. When people are genuinely in need, they cooperate with us and go through the proper channels for assistance. Sadly, too many are con artists and take advantage of the good nature of our people. It is with regret that I must write such a letter, but your well being is of significant concern and I so not wish any of you to be deceived or unjustly manipulated by these individuals.

Our Lady of Hope Grotto - Memorial Garden

4"x8" engraved brick memorials are now available for the brick pavement in front of the Grotto of Our Lady of Hope on the east side of the church. The funds raised as a result of this project will be used to complete the beautiful pipe organ in the church begun in 2002. The economic down turn and emergency repairs on the church building and systems, required a delay in completing the organ. While the entire organ has been in the building since 2004, there were only funds to have 1,500 of the 3,000 pipes working. The loudest sets of pipes were installed, leaving the softer sounds to be set up at a later time. Our organ is among the most beautiful on Long Island and is very unique in that it is built of "recycled heritage" parts, many over a century old. Our organ contains the choicest pipes of organs built by the best organ makers of the late 19th century through the 20th century. The magnificent carved oak case was formed of elaborate choir stalls from a former monastery chapel. The system which operates the keyboards and pipes is run by state of the art computers. Please consider memorializing a loved one, while at the same time helping the parish complete one of its most beautiful attributes.


