A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

This summer marks the 50th anniversary of arguably the greatest scientific accomplishment in history: the night of July 20, 1969, when Americans Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on the surface of the moon.

"We choose to go to the moon in this decade and do the other things," President Kennedy said, "not because they are easy, but because they are hard, because the goal will serve to organize and measure our best energies and skills, because the challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one which we intend to win."

In his brief Presidency, John F. Kennedy articulated a vision for America's great space adventure that harnessed the imagination and talents of our nation as never before. The night before his death, at supper with the Twelve, Jesus articulates a similar vision: a church brought together to realize His vision of the kingdom of God, a vision centered in the conviction that, in God, we belong to one another, a vision that lifts up and honors the gifts that each one of us brings to His table.

As we celebrate July 4 this week, let us remember we belong to God and to each other. We give thanks for our country; may God bless us all with a sense of care, gratitude and hope for our future as a people and a nation.



July 4, 1776 - A Free Nation is Born

The Great Awakening, a religious revival begun in the 1740s, infused the colonists with a zeal for independence in religious practice as well as government, thus reinforcing the principle of freedom from religious persecution/religious

freedom, that brought the first settlers to America.

After nearly a year of trying to resolve their differences with Britain concerning many grievances together with taxation without representation (the colonists had no say in the decisions of the English Parliament even though they were English citizens), in May, 1776, the 13 colonies sent delegates to the Second Continental Congress in Philadelphia. After nearly two months of prayer, discussion and debate, these "Founders" approved the **Declaration of Independence**, drafted by Thomas Jefferson.

"We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness."

Fascinating Facts for the Fourth:

- * The first Declaration of Independence draft presented to Congress blamed King George III for the slave trade, which Jefferson described as "a cruel war against human nature itself." Georgia and South Carolina delegates insisted the passage be removed.
- * When told that George Washington would return to private life and not remain in power if the U.S. won the American Revolution, King George III reportedly said, "Then truly he is the world's greatest man."
- * Three Founding Fathers and U.S. presidents died on the Fourth of July: Thomas Jefferson & John Adams on July 4, 1826, and James Monroe, July 4, 1831.
- * In 1776, 2.5 million new people lived in the U.S. Now, 243 years later, over 300 million people live here.

Our Lady of Hope Grotto - Memorial Garden

4"x8" engraved brick memorials are now available for the brick pavement in front of the Grotto of Our Lady of Hope on the east side of the church. The funds raised as a result of this project will be used to complete the beautiful pipe organ in the church begun in 2002. The economic down turn and emergency repairs on the church building and systems, required a delay in completing the organ. While the entire organ has been in the building since 2004, there were only funds to have 1,500 of the 3,000 pipes working. The loudest sets of pipes were installed, leaving the softer sounds to be set up at a later time. Our organ is among the most beautiful on Long Island and is very unique in that it is built of "recycled heritage" parts, many over a century old. Our organ contains the choicest pipes of organs built by the best organ makers of the late 19th century through the 20th century. The magnificent carved oak case was formed of elaborate choir stalls from a former monastery chapel. The system which operates the keyboards and pipes is run by state of the art computers. Please consider memorializing a loved one, while at the same time helping the parish complete one of its most beautiful attributes.


