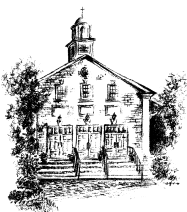

For the fiscal year just ended, our Parish reported its highest operating surplus in quite a few years. This is the result of the strong response of many parishioners to last fall's enhanced offertory campaign, which resulted in a significant increase in collections over the prior year.

I want to thank everyone who responded to the offertory campaign, and ask that you continue to support the Parish at the level you stepped up to. While Parish staff will continue to seek ways to control operating expenses, your support is vital to the continued financial health of the Parish.

As you read this, please be assured that I will continue to do all that I can to be a good steward of our Parish's many blessings and resources and that I pray for all of us so that we may continue our ministry together.
