A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This Sunday, October 27, 2019 a longtime active parishioner-Elizabeth O’Donnell-will receive the St. Agnes Medal for consistent and humble service to our parish. Beth is an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, a Lector and attends to the holy vessels used at Mass each day. Congratulations Beth!

In our early days as a community, the Roman Catholic Church designated November 1 as All Saints’ Day, in honor of all Catholic saints. It was celebrated with a mass, bonfires and people costumed as angels and saints parading through the villages. November 2 brings All Souls’ Day, a holy day set aside for honoring the dead and departed.

Just as November 1 was once called All Hallows’ Day, October 31 was called All Hallows’ Eve. Over time, All Hallows’ Eve was shortened to Halloween! It was at this time that the church and her people gave food/special treats to the poor and hungry, hence our current practice of distributing candy.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

In today’s Gospel reading, Jesus tells us of two individuals. A proud Pharisee and a humble tax collector. The latter, even though he was a tax collector, went home justified while the other did not. The tax collector’s humility was of great importance.
