RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The Religious Education office is happy to announce that we will be celebrating our sacraments!!

First Holy Communion will take place on Saturday, September 26 at 9:30am and 11:30am. The sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on Wednesday, October 7 at 9:30am and 11:30am. Please keep the children in your prayers. Letters have been sent out and a copy can be found on the Our Lady of Hope website.

We have all been anxiously waiting to see what this Religious Education year would look like. All parishes throughout Long Island have been working together to try to put the best programs we can under the current situation. The CDC protocols, as well as the government mandates that we would have had to put in place here at Our Lady of Hope, make it impossible for us to have in-person classes. After considering the safety of the children and our catechists, it has been determined that our Religious Education program for this year will be virtual. We will be implementing a brand new program which will keep our children and parents engaged in their faith. A detailed letter has gone out to parents and catechists explaining our program for this year. We thank the parents and catechists for all their support throughout the year.

Taking into consideration the unusual accommodations that parents and children need to comply with for the starting of this school year, Religious Education classes will start Monday, November 2 for all levels. This will allow parents and children time to adjust to these new changes.

Calling all catechists: The Religious Education office is asking for your time and talent to teach our children about our faith and our relationship with Jesus. If you would like to teach, please contact the office at 334-4781, we would be very happy to have you join our community of catechists.

FOOD PANTRY NEWS

Since April, the Food Pantry has been operating on a once-a-month schedule for our clients, as compared to the every-other-week schedule from the past. Instead of handing our food in Midura Hall, we ask clients to stay outside in their cars and we deliver food bags directly into their trunks. We coordinate with the St. Vincent de Paul Society who are present to hand out grocery store vouchers.

We have been able to continue to offer food due to the generosity of the community. Over these past months, a food drive publicized on Facebook, gathered great results. Thank you to all who participated. The Carle Place Fire Department and the Senior Citizens organization have had drives to fill our shelves. Parishioners have donated cash so we are able to buy items needed. Weekly food donations continue to be placed in the pantry bin in the vestibule of the church.

Currently, we are operation with a reduced staff as many of our committee members are staying safely away from extra social interaction. We still work downstairs, packing bags and stocking shelves, just on a more regulated, controlled schedule.

We plan on continuing in this manner for the foreseeable future. Plans for the holidays are still under discussion and we will seek your assistance when we decide on the details.

Finally, something we beg you to be aware of is the expiration dates on donated food. As people have sheltered in place, evidently more house cleaning of kitchens has been done. We have received many very large cartons of expired food that we cannot distribute to people. While we personally may use these items in our own home, we cannot give out expired items. This food creates a lot of work to move, sort through and dispose. We appreciate the thoughts but cannot use these things.

Currently the pantry is in need of :

- Bottled juice
- Jarred pasta sauce
- Boxed dry potatoes
- Canned vegetables

We thank you for your generous support. You are the only reason this stewardship can exist.

Our Lady of Hope Grotto - Memorial Garden

4"x8" engraved brick memorials are now available for the brick pavement in front of the Grotto of Our Lady of Hope on the east side of the church. The funds raised as a result of this project will be used to complete the beautiful pipe organ in the church begun in 2002. The economic down turn and emergency repairs on the church building and systems, required a delay in completing the organ. While the entire organ has been in the building since 2004, there were only funds to have 1,500 of the 3,000 pipes working. The loudest sets of pipes were installed, leaving the softer sounds to be set up at a later time. Our organ is among the most beautiful on Long Island and is very unique in that it is built of "recycled heritage" parts, many over a century old. Our organ contains the choicest pipes of organs built by the best organ makers of the late 19th century through the 20th century. The magnificent carved oak case was formed of elaborate choir stalls from a former monastery chapel. The system which operates the keyboards and pipes is run by state of the art computers. Please consider memorializing a loved one, while at the same time helping the parish complete one of its most beautiful attributes.

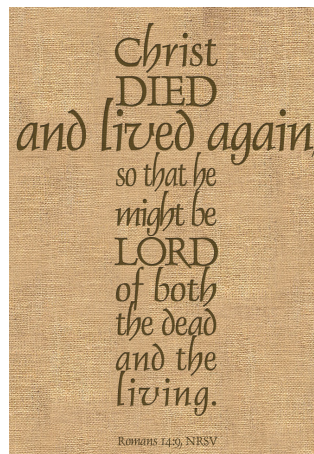
