Level 7 Reflections

The Sunday Liturgy (Mass) is the gathering of the faithful to pray and give praise to God. During the liturgy we hear the Word of God proclaimed; the Celebrant (priest) or deacon shares his thoughts on the Word so that we may take the Word with us as we leave the Church. One way for us to truly live out the Word of God is to spend time reflecting on what these words mean to us.

Each candidate must write a Reflection on the Gospel for:

- (5) Sunday Masses during the year
- ❖ (1) Holy Day of Obligation
- ❖ (1) Stations Reflection

All Reflections are ultimately due by March 1st.

There are designated pages for these reflections attached. Please note the due dates for each of these reflections. The reflection is due to the Religious Education office by the date at the top of the page. You can hand it in earlier but not later than the stated date. There is a box for the reflections outside the office door that you can place any Rel Ed papers at any time. I would recommend a **folder** for all students to keep copies of their Mass Reflections in and to take to Religion class each week for any materials and notices of events, etc, that are given out for families to be aware of.

**Suggestions on how to write these papers:

- Bring a pad of paper with you to church and write down some thoughts or words you hear in the Gospel and homily, do not attempt to write down every word.
- Write down the scripture reference (e.g. Luke 5:1-5-refer to the Weekly Missal) of the gospel so you can refer back to it when you are writing your reflection.
- On the way home in the car, discuss what you heard and wrote down asking everyone to participate.
- Ask yourself and your family-what the scripture and homily have to do with your life today. What
 message did Jesus have for you!
- When you get home, write your reflection while it is fresh in your mind, the longer you delay it,
 and the harder it will be to pull your thoughts together.

Remember, this is a reflection paper; what you write is what you feel the scripture is saying to you at this moment. There is no right or wrong answers. Your reflection should be well thought out and neatly written.
