CHRISTMAS INITIATIVES FOR PS10X AND MADONNA HEIGHTS

In previous years, prior to Covid 19, Our Lady of Hope collected gifts for Madonna Heights through the Giving Tree and collected toys for PS 10x at 817 in the Bronx. We would like to continue that custom but in a little different way this year. You, the parishioners of Our Lady of Hope, are always very generous and we have already received phone calls regarding these programs and if they will continue. So the way that has been decided to move forward is this: We are asking for gift cards **only**. This will eliminate the congestion in the main office and also possibly lessen foot traffic during a season where virus spread is a concern.

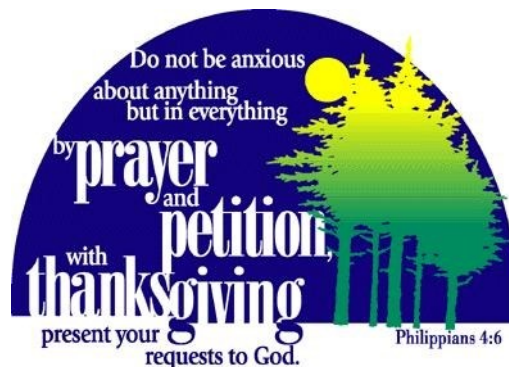

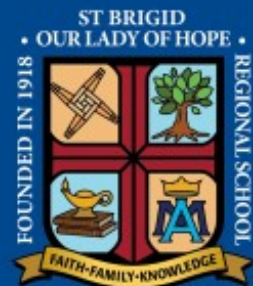
