A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

A blessed St. Valentine weekend to all our parishioners! Traditionally a time of celebrating love expressed through letters and cards, I pray that all of you may know the great gift of love in your hearts.

The Diocese of Rockville Centre, together with dioceses throughout the United States, have been directed to refrain from the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of the faithful due to the pandemic. Rome has issued the following Instruction: The priest or deacon will silently bless the ashes with holy water and then turn to the congregation and pronounce-Repent and believe in the Gospel! The priest/deacon cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and then distributes the ashes by inviting those gathered to come forward in a single file (socially distant). Wearing masks and bowing their heads slightly, the faithful receive ashes which will be sprinkled over the tops of their head.

In the Diocese of Rockville Centre this year, it is <u>not permitted</u> to impose ashes on the forehead of a member of the faithful with the thumb of the hand, even if that hand is gloved. Hands and gloves would be considered "contaminated" after each imposition of ashes if physical contact were made.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT

This Wednesday, February 17 is Ash Wednesday and the first day of the Holy Season of Lent. Ashes will be distributed that day at mass at 9am and at services at 12:15pm, 3:30pm and 7pm. (Please see "A Message from Our Pastor" regarding the distribution of ashes) Please remember that Ash Wednesday is NOT a holy day of obligation and no Catholic is obliged to attend Mass or receive ashes. Please join us on Fridays during Lent for the Stations of the Cross at 7:30pm.

May the upcoming holy season offer you an opportunity for prayer, reflection and growth in God's grace. Some have inquired about the practice of fast and abstinence:

Fasting obliges all Catholics from ages 18 to 59 inclusive) to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On the fast days, we may take on full meal, two smaller meals and no snacking in between meals. Abstinence obliges all Catholics (14 years and older) to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday AND all other Fridays in Lent.

If you wish to donate the bread and wine for the week's Sunday and daily Eucharist celebrations, the offering is \$50. Opportunities to donate a Rose for Life are also available. The offering is \$5 per week. The sanctuary candle is available for memorialization. The offering is \$15.
