The importance of this commandment is seen in the way Jesus reacts against those who have made commerce—selling animals and changing money—their gods, their idols.

Fasting obliges all Catholics (from ages 18 to 59 inclusive) to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On the fast days, we may take one full

meal, two smaller meals and no snacking in between meals. Abstinence obliges all Catholics (14 years and older) to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday AND all other Fridays in Lent. (Continued from page 2)
