LITURGY OF THE WORD

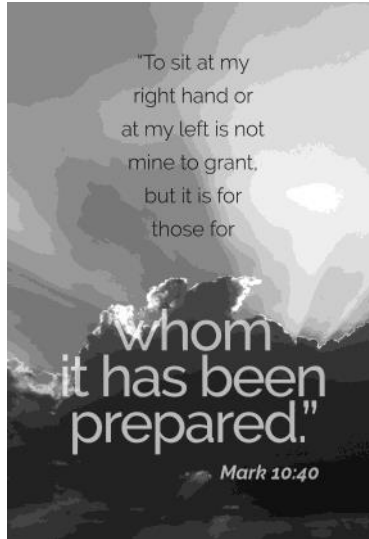

Web Designer Petitions Supreme Court to Affirm Religious Freedom

A Colorado website designer is appealing a lower-court decision depriving her of the right to conduct her business according to her religious beliefs. "The government shouldn't weaponize the law to force a web designer to speak messages that violate her beliefs. This case involves quintessential free speech and artistic freedom ...," said an Alliance Defending Freedom attorney. ⁽¹⁾ The lower court's decision "empowers the government to force everyone to speak government-approved messages and subverts our core understandings of the First Amendment." ⁽²⁾

In a similar case CO cake artist Jack Phillips, the U.S. Supreme Court scolded Colorado for its "hostility" to Christianity.

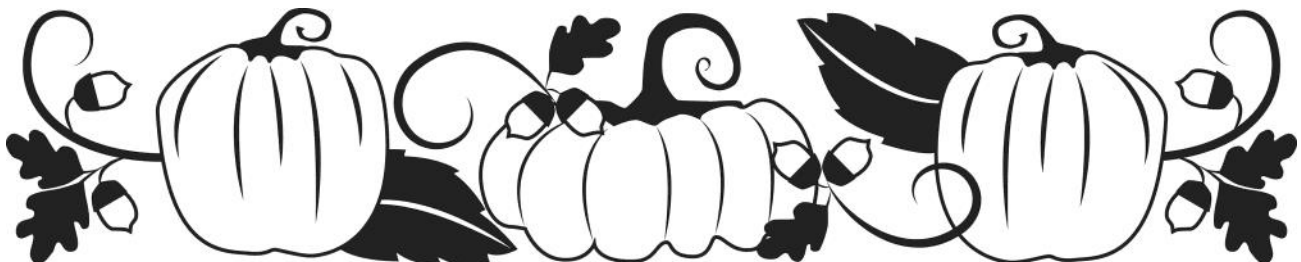

Throughout his life, this Founding Father and 2nd President of the United States, exhibited a profound respect for the Bible and references it frequently in his writings. A Letter from a Parishioner Regarding: OCTOBER AND RESPECT LIFE MONTH

Hello – I am Paul Monaco and a member of Our Lady of Hope Parish. After seeing the movie, UNPLANNED, a few years ago I was inspired to join a prayer movement: Forty Days For Life.

UNPLANNED is a movie about Abbey Johnson who worked as a volunteer for Planned Parenthood. Eventually, she was hired and ultimately became “Employee of the Year” for her facilitation in offering abortions. One day, she asked to assist in an abortion – something she had never done. A sonogram machine was positioned so that the pregnant woman could not view it but the doctor and Abbey were able to watch clearly and uninterrupted. Abbey held the hand of the woman undergoing the procedure and what she saw on the sonogram screen was so disturbing to her that she left her job and activities at Planned Parenthood. She turned to a group, Forty Days for Life, led by Sean Carney. Abbey started a support group: And Then there Were None – which has assisted other one time Planned Parenthood and abortion workers in getting involved in life saving positions.

Forty Days for Life is a group of men and women who pray, particularly the Rosary, at abortion clinics for an end to the taking of innocent lives. It is believed that many, many unborn children have been saved through the power of prayer and presence of those who participate in Forty Days for Life. Some statistics estimate that as many as a million babies are aborted each year!

I am inviting you to join Forty Days for Life - pray with us at the Planned Parenthood Facility in Hempstead. Your presence not only speaks about the prayers you offer but may afford someone the opportunity to “rethink” their decision and choose LIFE. You need only be present for an hour – or more if you wish –between 9am and 6pm, at your convenience. The campaign ends on October 30th. 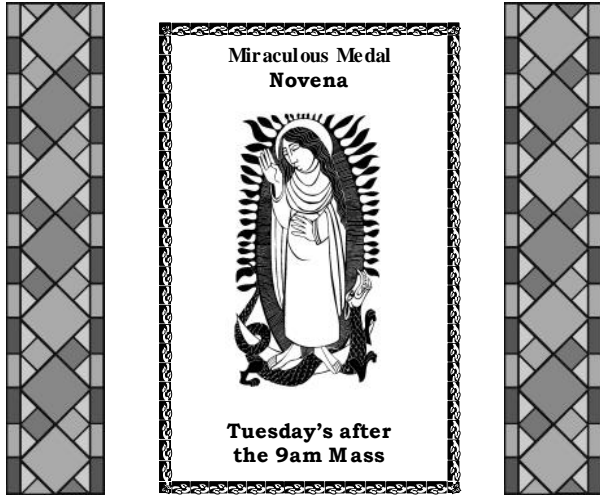


