LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the introductory reading from Luke’s Gospel, Jesus enters Jerusalem as the crowd praises God. The prophet Isaiah foretells God’s servant who hears and speaks his word and does not turn back from suffering. Paul writes to the Philippians, praising Jesus, who humbled himself and was exalted by God. In the Gospel, Jesus shares a Passover supper with His disciples, where He gives them bread and wine—which is His body and blood—to eat and drink. Afterward, He prays at the Mount of Olives and then is betrayed, tried and crucified.

May the upcoming holy season offer you an opportunity for prayer, reflection and growth in God’s grace. Some have inquired about the practice of fast and abstinence:

Fasting obliges all Catholics (from ages 18 to 59 inclusive) to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On the fast days, we may take one full meal, two smaller meals and no snacking in between meals. Abstinence obliges all Catholics (14 years and older) to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday AND all other Fridays in Lent.

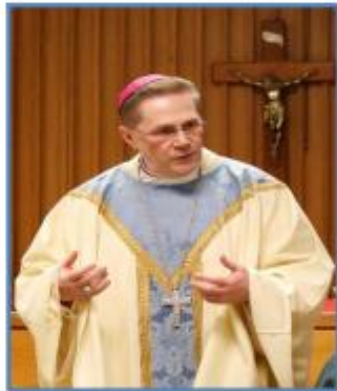
