In the Gospel, Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan expands the understanding of "neighbor" to include those we might consider strangers or even enemies, and "love" modeled on His example of selflessness and sacrifice.

In April 2022 Bishop Barres appointed Father Kevin Dillon as the new pastor of Our Lady of Hope, Carle Place.

Born to Gerard and Dolores Dillon in March of 1961, Father Kevin is the oldest of four children. Fr. Kevin has 2 sisters and one brother all residing here on Long Island. In 1965, his family moved from Brooklyn to Williston Park. He attended St. Aidan School and graduated in 1975. From there, Fr. Kevin went on to the former St. Pius X Preparatory Seminary High School where he graduated in 1979.

During the 1980's, Father Kevin attended Nassau Community College and Queens College where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in English and a Master's Degree in English Education. Fr. Kevin holds a New York Permanent Certification as a teacher of English to Secondary School students. While attending college, he worked as a Training and Development Instructor for the Dime Savings Bank of New York.

Upon graduating college, Father Kevin taught seventh and eighth grade English in several Catholic elementary schools, including Our Lady of Fatima-Scarsdale, St. Mary's-Roslyn, and St. Anastasia-Douglaston.

Father Kevin always felt called to the priesthood, and after his dad's death in 1990, he thought seriously about entering the seminary, and in September 1991 he entered Cathedral Residence of the Immaculate Conception in Douglaston to begin his studies for the priesthood. From there he attended the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington until 1994. At that time, still not completely certain if God was calling him to the priesthood, he withdrew to reflect and discern God's plan for him. He returned to teaching and worked at several Catholic and public high schools, including St. Dominic High School-Oyster Bay, Suncoast Community High School-Riviera Beach Florida and Bishop Guertin High School in Nashua New Hampshire.

In 2000, Father Kevin still felt called to the priesthood, and so resumed his studies for priestly formation at the Diocesan Seminary in Huntington. He was ordained June 14, 2003 and has served as Associate Pastor in several parishes of the Diocese, including St. Brigid Westbury in 2003 to 2005, St. Jude Mastic Beach in 2005 to 2007 and St. Aidan Williston Park from 2007 to 2015. From there Father Kevin went to St. Boniface Martyr in Sea Cliff as pastor and has served the faithful there since then. He now comes to Our Lady of Hope and looks forward to serving our parish and getting to know the parishioners here.

Father Kevin is a fan of the New York Yankees as well as the New York Rangers. He has a passion for fitness and exercise and enjoys working out with his trainers. He enjoys spending time with his family and friends. He like to travel and has run several pilgrimages to Europe and the Holy Land. He also enjoys reading and visiting book stores. Finally, Father Kevin likes to sing and attended a Voice Lesson Class in Vienna Austria where he studied with the Director of the Vienna Boys Choir and composed his own song.

Focus on Religious Freedom

Supreme Court Rejects Maine's Ban on Tuition Aid to Religious Schools

"There is nothing neutral about Maine's program," wrote Chief Justice John Roberts. "The state pays tuition for certain students at private schools - so long as the schools are not religious. That is discrimination against religion." ⁽¹⁾

In a 6-3 decision, the Supreme Court decided in favor of families challenging a Maine law that prohibited them from receiving a state school tuition benefit because they chose to send their children to religious affiliated schools. Since some rural areas of Maine lack the student population sufficient to justify building a public school, the state provides a tuition benefit parents can use to pay for the school of their choice - unless the school is religious. In fact, some families have used this tuition benefit towards some academically selective prep schools. In a similar Montana case in a 2020 Supreme Court ruling, Justice Roberts wrote, "A state need not subsidize private education. But once a state decides to do so, it cannot disqualify some private schools solely because they are religious." ⁽²⁾

"The Court has again affirmed that states cannot exclude religious schools from generally-available public benefits based on their religious affiliation or exercise. In our pluralistic society, it is vital that all people of faith be able to participate in publicly available programs and so contribute to the common good," said Cardinal Dolan and Bishop Daly, chairmen of the USCCB Committees for Religious Liberty and Catholic Education. ⁽³⁾

Supreme Court Affirms Freedom of Religion and Speech for High School Football Coach

The Supreme Court ruled 6-3 in favor of HS coach and former U.S. Marine Jo Kennedy's right to pray quietly in thanksgiving after football games. The coach prayed for less than a minute on the 50-yard line after games when the players and coaches had already shaken hands and he was no longer coaching.

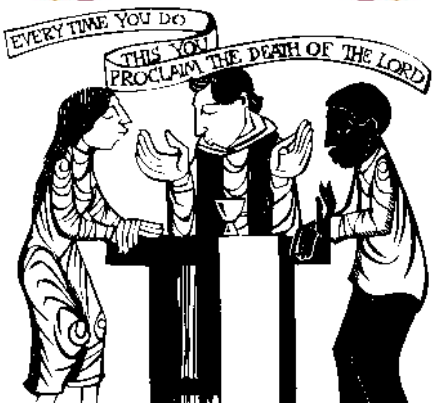
In the fall of 2015, Bremerton school officials tried to put an end to Kennedy's practice of thanksgiving by amending district policies with a new ban on "demonstrative religious activity, readily observable to students and the attending public."⁽⁴⁾

"Respect for religious expression is indispensable to life in a free and diverse Republic - whether these expressions take place in a sanctuary or on the field, and whether they manifest through the spoken word or a bowed head," explained Justice Neil Gorsuch for the Court's majority. This decision also reminds the lower courts to be particularly vigilant when schools undermine the twin freedoms of religion and speech. "That the First Amendment doubly protects religious speech is no accident. It is a natural outgrowth of the framers' distrust of government attempts to regulate religion and suppress dissent," wrote Gorsuch. ⁽⁵⁾
