


A plea from the Religious Education office:

I come to You in thanksgiving knowing that all that I am and all that I have are gifts from You. Teach me to be generous with these gifts that You have given to me.


I know that You want me to accept these gifts, cultivate them, and return them with increase, and that I may do that only through You. Help me to be Your faithful, evangelizing steward.

There is a "polite persecution" in America and the world that "takes away from man and woman their freedom as well as their right to conscientious objection." - Pope Francis

Victims of Polite Persecution in 2022

"I haven't been tortured or thrown in prison. I have my fingernails. I have a few extra gray hairs. But the thing is (polite persecution) is going beyond nondiscrimination into pushing a particular set of ideas," said Rev. Dr. Bernard Randall, bishop of the Church of England and former chaplain at a Christian K-12 school in Cambridge, in his address at the annual International Religious Freedom Summit in Washington D.C., June 28-30, 2022. ⁽¹⁾ Three years ago, Rev. Randall was fired from his chaplain position for "gross misconduct" and reported to Child Protective Services and the British Government Anti-Terrorism Prevent Program as a potential violent extremist or instigator of violent extremism after he gave a school chapel sermon in which he said that it is okay for students to believe that biological sex in unchangeable, marriage is between a man and a woman, and that gender identity language was incoherent, if they came to such conclusions.

Rev. Randall believes it is important to fight against the religious discrimination he experienced as a professing Christian. "My story sends a message to other Christians that you are not free to talk about your faith. It seems it is no longer enough to just tolerate (alternate sexual or marriage) ideology. You must accept it without question and no debate is allowed without serious consequences. Someone else will decide what is and what isn't acceptable, and suddenly you can become an outcast, possibly for the rest of your life." ⁽²⁾


