



We all have been touched by the rising inflation rate - close to 8% on Long Island and the highest in 40 years. The spike in gas and food prices combined with the high cost of housing has caused a big financial burden on our Long Island Community. safety and well-being.


Our brothers and sisters, Lord, are once again threatened by aggressors who see them only as simple ob-


