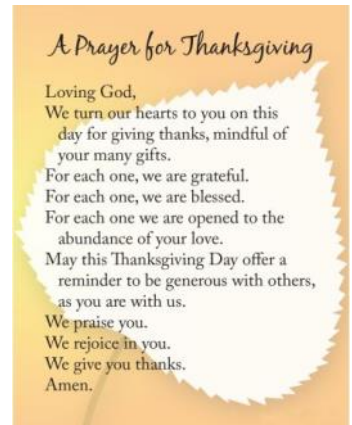
In today's Gospel, the Good Thief realized the error of his ways. Instead of just disregarding his errors, he turned to Jesus for forgiveness.

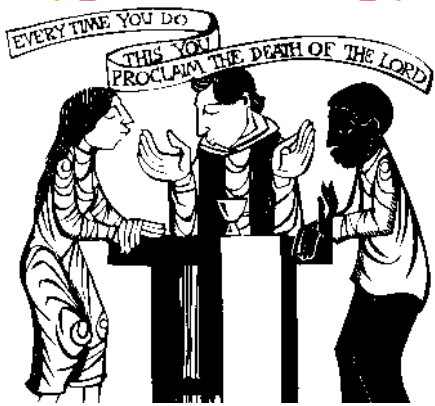

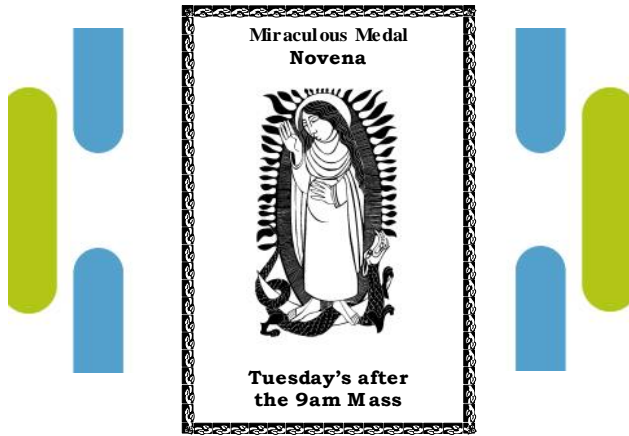
