We continue to thrive because of the generosity of you and the community. We are always looking for volunteers to join us. Contact the Church office if interested.


HOLY HOUR



January 31, 2023 Memorial of Saint John Bosco

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Each year, the Church throughout the United States takes the opportunity to celebrate the gift of Catholic Education during Catholic Schools Week which, this year, began on January 29, 2023 and concludes on February 4, 2023. 
