Isaiah sings of the vineyard that yielded wild grapes. Paul writes to the Philippians that they will have peace from God if they make their requests known to Him and think about things that are worthy of praise. He tells the chief priests and elders that the kingdom of God will be taken from them and given to a people that will produce its fruit.




