LITURGY OF THE WORD

The readings for this most sacred night reflect God's work throughout history. In Genesis and Exodus, God creates everything that is, making man and woman in His likeness: He makes a promise to Abraham and his descendants: and frees the Israelites from slavery. The prophets speak of God's love and relationship to His people, His invitation to turn to Him in all things, and His promise of salvation.

The Epistle reminds us of the new life in Christ we receive upon our baptism. In the Gospel, Mary Magdalene and the other women came to the tomb and there they saw a young man clothed in a white robe who said, You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; He is not here.



EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

YES, CHRIST MY HOPE IS ARISEN; TO GALILEE HE GOES BEFORE YOU

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Not even death could keep Him from us. So mighty is His love that He transformed the evil of the cross into a blessing through which He can eternally unite us to God. He is here. He is risen, alleluia!

Easter 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter to you and your families! Thank you for your love for the inspired Word of God. Thank you for your love for the Resurrection appearances of our Lord in this Easter season and the way your lives are set on fire in your meditation and contemplation of these mysteries.

Thank you for your fidelity to the Eucharist and the Sunday Mass and your Catholic spirit of evangelization. Thank you for being instruments of Eucharistic Revival.

In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis states: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force...Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history...Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

We continue to live through "the storms of history" and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world.¹ We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord's Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.




